

Discipleship By Shawn Hippern

Going into 2023, we continued to work to accomplish our mission to make disciples as we "teach, baptize, and disciple to maturity in Christ". At Emmanuel we try to provide intentional opportunities to lead people towards deeper transformation and spiritual maturity through a commitment to WORSHIP, GROW, and SERVE God. Are you committed to growing in discipleship as you Worship, Grow, and Serve at Emmanuel? What is the next step you need to take?

Welcome, Communication & Newcomers Ministry

Discipleship starts the moment anyone walks through the front door! We have been excited to see many newcomers at Emmanuel over the past year: some new to the community and some new to Emmanuel. We are intentional about helping newcomers get connected with our Welcome Team (greeters, welcome desk, ushers and welcome team members at large) and filling out our Guest Card so that we can follow up by emails, texts and phone calls to create relationships, and to extend an invitation to our Newcomers Lunches. We regularly maintain a newcomers list at Emmanuel so we can become familiar with the faces walking through the door! Effective communication also requires that we regularly and effectively maintain our website, social media, email, texting platform. YouTube channel, and our weekly announcement slides. I have appreciated all those who serve in our Welcome Ministry, and those who help run our Newcomers Lunches as well. We were also excited to put together an updated Church Directory in the past year.

Small Groups, Ministry Groups, Bible Studies

After a commitment to corporate WORSHIP gatherings, the next step in our intentional process of discipleship is to see everyone GROW spiritually in the context of building authentic biblical relationships and digging deeper into God's Word by being committed to a Small Group, Ministry Group, or Bible Study. As the church gets bigger, it must continually get smaller. Over the past year, our Small Groups Ministry has grown as we con-









tinued with our Sermon Based Small Groups, including seeing a couple new groups started. We work to discover and develop new small groups but our biggest challenge in small group ministry is finding small group leaders. We currently have 14 small groups meeting in Bloomfield, Picton, Wellington, Carrying Place, and online. We would love to see small groups available in Belleville, Trenton, Consecon, Demorestville, Northport, Milford, South Bay, Waupoos, Cherry Valley... I think you get the point! Pray with us to see this happen! Thank you to our amazing small group leaders who serve above and beyond, and to all those who are committed to small groups at Emmanuel or have taken a step of faith to join a small group this past year.

As important as our small groups are to discipleship at Emmanuel, so are our Ministry Groups. Ministry Groups function with the same purpose as small groups but meet more unique or specific needs. I am thankful for our Celebrate Recovery Ministry, our She Works His Way Women's Discipleship Group, our ALPHA course Ministry, and our Youth & Children's Ministry that all work to make disciples and promote spiritual growth in the context of Biblical Community. Thank you to those who lead these ministries.

We are also grateful for a Lead Pastor who is gifted and loves to teach God's Word. Pastor Peter continues to have Bible study on Sunday night and Wednesday morning and afternoon each week, and these studies include time for building biblical community through sharing and praying for one another. Although these groups are larger than the average small group, they work to function as a small group and with the purpose of making disciples.

Finally, know that spiritual growth and maturity happens as we SERVE. We continue to try and find ways to encourage each person at Emmanuel to find their place to serve both in the body of Christ, and just as important, in the community. We encourage every believer at Emmanuel to consider, discover, develop, and use their Spiritual Gifts and to find a place to serve at Emmanuel in a Ministry or Ministry Team such as our Welcome Ministry, Children's Ministry, Discipleship Ministry, Hospitality Ministry, Worship & Audio/Video, Outreach and Missions, Prayer Ministry, and Congregational Care. From time to time, we have serving Signups to help promote serving at Emmanuel. Ideally, our desire is to see every person at Emmanuel serving in at least one ministry.



There are also other opportunities and means of discipleship that we encourage such as Baptism, one-on-one discipleship, our marriage ministry, professional Christian counselling, our RightNow Media subscription, our Church Library, and our other online resources that you can find under the resources tab on our church website.

Personally

On a personal note, although it has been another challenging year of ministry, it has been a great blessing to serve at Emmanuel again this past year. The Body of Christ here at Emmanuel is such an encouraging, gracious, persevering, faithful, and supportive one. With challenges that we faced as a family this year, I was able to take a 3-month sabbatical with the support and encouragement of our congregation and Elders board. During World War II, England needed to increase its production of coal. Winston Churchill called together labour leaders to enlist their support. At the end of his presentation he asked them to picture in their minds a parade which he knew would be held in London after the war.

First, he said, would come the sailors who had kept the vital sea lanes open. Then would come the soldiers who had come home from Dunkirk and then gone on to defeat Rommel in Africa. Then would come the pilots who had driven the Luftwaffe from the sky.

Pinecrest Housing by Ken How & Donna Rodgers



2023 opened with a new name that reflects what we are and how the community knows us, the feedback from the community has been very supportive. Pinecrest Housing has also undertaken to have the 20-acre piece of property severed into three parcels for development, this action was taken due to the CMHC guidelines for future development. The County has approved this process, and we are now completing the various tasks needed to complete this process.

Unfortunately, our architect died in November, which we were very sad about as he was so very enthusiastic about the Pinecrest Housing project. We have secured a new architect, who has experience in repurposing vacated schools. However, this has pushed our ability to have the drawings needed for CMHC by about three months. We were successful in receiving an Investment Readiness Grant from the Federal Government which has helped us pay for the Class A reports and drawings needed for our CMHC Application.

Last summer, there was another successful Canada Summer Jobs contract at the site, completing more demolition and keeping the grounds in good shape. Last fall, a group of volunteers planted about 300 trees to replace those that did not survive the winter and we will be doing the same this spring. A big thank you to those who came out and, despite the rain, cheerfully planted trees.

Work is still underway to obtain Charitable Status and we are trusting the Lord that this will be obtained.

Last year, two of our Board Members retired, Paul Robinson and John Uings, and we want to take this opportunity to thank them for their diligent, hard work on the team. We have welcomed two new Board Members, Paul Pryce and Des Norris and welcome the expertise that they bring to the team. All Board members are volunteers, and they attend endless meetings, video conferences, read dozens of emails, fill out reams of paperwork, hold meetings with community partners and at the same time devote many hours to keep the site in shape.

At this time, we want to thank our Developer, Phil Spry and Contractor, Andy Spry for their endless hours of hard work and support, they are truly a gift from the Lord.

We want to give a special thank you to all of those who donate monthly, which helps keep the insurance, water, hydro, and taxes paid. Included in the special thanks are all of you, along with Mary Anne Barrett, who pray for Pinecrest Housing. God bless you all.

It has now been five years that we have partnered with the community of eNhlanhleni in running a CarePoint that feeds a solid meal to over 250 children each day. In addition, grief counselling sessions are held for the many children who have lost parents or other family members to AIDS. Discipleship classes are held and school fees for middle and high school are paid for promising students. The community of eNhlanhleni has demonstrated strong support of the Care Point.

Earlier in the year the sports ministry arm of AIM hosted a number of children from our Care Point at a soccer tournament. At a Gospel presentation held during the tournament, it is reported that many children from our Care Point came to know Jesus.

This past year two significant initiatives were started and prayer is appreciated as we

work towards bringing both to completion in 2024:1. The eNhlanhleni community, along with Swazi staff of AIM, put together a Care Point Plan that indicates their priorities for development for their community. We are currently developing our response to their proposals

The foodbank believes that everyone has the right to food security and an acceptable standard of living. We currently serve about 100 households. This represents 400 individuals and approximately 150 of them are 18 years and under. We are more than a foodbank, we also support programs for 60 senior meals, healthy food packs for kids, backpacks and school supplies, holiday hampers, snowsuit campaign, Christmas angels and PJs and stocking fund. New Life Women's Home

2023 was a big year for New Life. After a number of years without a facility and a program, the ministry opened a beautiful new lodge just north of Belleville in September. (See picture below) Support from the community in terms of donations and volunteer labour has been very strong and the lodge was opened debt-free at a ribbon-cutting and Open House on Sept 16.

The lodge contains a large kitchen and dining room, a large meeting room plus offices and smaller meeting rooms. In addition, it contains a suite that can accommodate up to 5 residents.

A separate dormitory, with a capacity of 9 residents, is currently under construction and is expected to be completed in May or June of this year. The program began in the Fall on a small scale and is currently at capacity with 5 residents. newlifecanada.org

In addition, a new missions donee was added during the year to the list of missions we support - not included in the original budget



Looking back at 2023 from a financial viewpoint, we, at Emmanuel, can definitely say we were blessed! As I've been thinking more about the word, "blessed," and after looking into some of the Biblical definitions, I found that usually, in the Old Testament, a blessing was given as a public declaration of a favoured status with God, this served as a guide and motivation to pursue a course of life within the blessing. Whereas the New Testament focuses more on being blessed spiritually and in pursuing a life of holiness. Also, several resources stated that "Blessed" comes from the equivalent Greek word makários, which describes a believer as being in an envi-



able position for receiving God's provisions (favour) - by extension of His grace. (grace: is giving favour or blessing that is not deserved.) We usually use the phrase "I am blessed" to portray a humble attitude, for receiving good fortune, good luck, or having worked hard at achieving a desired outcome, or comfort, and miss out on the fact that these undeserved blessings, which God gives us, through grace, ought to be received with thanksgiving and praise, leading us to find joy as we glorify God for them. Unfortunately, we are prone to attitudes of entitlement, pride, and seeking happiness in worldly circumstances because of these "blessings". I was surprised to find one of the definitions of the word blessed is "to be made holy / consecrated", which only comes through our salvation in Jesus Christ (our being made aware of our wretched state, led to repentance, sanctified for holiness, and to one day receive the crown of righteousness). All other earthly blessings (rewards) should pale in comparison to this! As we look ahead to a new year, I'd like to challenge us all to renew our view of being blessed - and instead see ourselves as "being made Holy". May we continue to give God the opportunity to use each one of us to share His Blessings, "GRACE", to those around us.


Children's Ministry by Shawn Hippern
