- **Resolve** To be faithful to God, give Him honour and to glorify Him. Philippians 3:14



- 9. What kind of person would you like to be? Do you think that God sees you as that kind of person? What are the challenges, or obstacles, stopping you from being that person?
- 10. In order for Gideon to become the person that God saw him as being, he was going to have to take a step of faith. And, as the angel said, "go in the strength that you have." What was God's promise to him (verse 16)?
- 11. If you are going to be the Person that God wants you to be, what steps do you need to take? (Remember, God has promised to be with you).

- 1. Read Judges 6:1-6. Try to imagine what it was like living in Israel at that time. Why do you think it took seven years before they, "cried out to God?"
- 2. Read Judges 6:7-10. After crying out to God, He sent them a prophet who told them the reason they were being oppressed. However, the people didn't seem to have listened to the prophet because, as we will see next week (from Judges 6:27-30), they didn't stop their idol worship.

What ways do we "hear from God' today?

Why do you think, when we hear from God, we don't respond immediately?

- 3. Go back to Judges Chapter 2. Read 2:6-16. We see there, a cycle of rebellion. The people rebelled through idolatry and disbelief; God brought judgment through foreign oppression; God raises up a deliverer, or Judge, to deliver them; The people repented and turned back to God. When the people fell back into sin, the cycle started all over again.
 - Do you think the same kind of cycle happens today? Why do you think we don't recognise the signs?
- 4. Read 2:10. From this we see there was a cycle that took place within the generations of people. First, a generation that knew God. Then a generation that knew about God, which led to a generation that didn't know God. Explain why you think this happens in families.
 - What can we do to stop the cycle? (By the way, it is never too late to do the right thing)
- 5. Read Judges 6:11-16. What do you think Gideon's initial reaction was to seeing the angel?

Do you think you might have had an interaction with an angel? (Read Hebrews 13:2)

- 6. What was the angel's greeting to Gideon (v.12)? What two main things do we learn from what he said to him?
- 7. Gideon didn't think that the Lord was with him (v.13). What does this say about Gideon's relationship to God at this time?

Why do you think Gideon couldn't see the relationship between Israel's sin and God's judgement? Do we see the relationship between sin and judgement in our lives personally?

(Note: In this case, God's judgement was on the nation as a whole and would have affected those who were seeking to live Godly lives as well as the ungodly - Do you think that we see this happening in our world today?)
