Remember, it was a lamb that was slaughtered as a sacrifice to atone for the sins of the people. The blood of that lamb was put on the door posts and lintel, so that the angel of death would pass over the people of Israel, and they would be saved.

How do you think the events of that first 'good friday' impacted the conversation around the table?

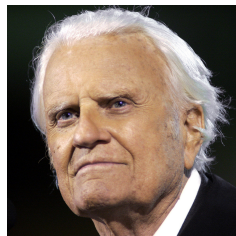
How does our relationship with Jesus impact the conversation around our table?

1. Read Matthew 16:24. We discussed denying oneself last week, and how it meant surrender. In what ways must we surrender?
2. Some use the phrase, "that's a cross I have to bear," referring to hardship or difficulty etc. But crucifixion was a horrible death, intended to inflict agonising pain in a public way, so as to deter others from doing anything against the law of Rome. With this in mind, what do you think it really means to take up your cross?
3. Read Mark 15:16-21. Put yourself in the position of the family of Simon of Cyrene. You've just arrived in Jerusalem, excited to be celebrating passover. If you were one of the family, what would be going through your mind if you saw your husband, or father, dragged away by the Romans to carry the cross of Jesus?

If you were Simon, what do you suppose might have been the interaction between Jesus and you?

4. Simon was forced to carry the cross of Jesus. We are called to choose to carry our own cross. Realising that to carry one's cross meant to die to your old life, what is being put to death?
5. Read Romans 3:23, 5:8, 6:23, and 2 Corinthians 5:21. From these verses, how would you define the doctrine of substitutionary atonement?
6. Read John 19:30. When Jesus was dying, he cried out, "It is finished." What did Jesus mean by that?

The word = Tetelestai (Τετέλεσται) has been found written on ancient invoices, meaning, "Paid in Full." What does that mean in relation to your life?

7. Read 1 Peter 2:24. Dying to your old life also means that you are going to live a new life. What does it mean to, "live for righteousness."

In practical ways what does this new life look like (Make sure that you think about every aspect of your life - the way you think, behave, talk etc.).
