



- 8. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:15-18. This passage ends with, "...therefore encourage one another with these words. Again, this verse uses the same root word for encourage as the word for comfort (parakaleo). From this passage what is the key to knowing this kind of encouragement (comfort)?
- 9. Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted. This second beatitude follows, 'blessed are the poor in spirit.' As we realise our spiritual poverty, and then mourn over our sin, we come into the presence of God, who forgives us and comes alongside us. It is then that we can know the comfort that God brings in the midst of grief, because we know the future that Jesus has gone to prepare for us. - 2. Read John 14:1-6. Jesus had just told the disciples that He was going to be crucified. He now says to them, "do not let your hearts be troubled." The disciples must have sensed some very intense emotions at that time Why could Jesus say what he said? Explain.
- 3. Work through the rest of that passage and answer the following questions: Who are we to trust in? What is Jesus referring to?
 What is Jesus going to do?

4. Thomas is speaking for all of the disciples when he says, "We don't know where you are going, so how can we know the way?"

With that in mind, how does that help you understand Matthew 5:4?

7. Read 1 Thessalonians 4:13-14. This passage gives us the reasons that we are blessed and can find comfort.
