

Pastor Peter said that Mercy isn't only seen in grand gestures, but in every-day life. Give some examples of mercy being shown in day to day interactions with others.

- 3. Read John 8:1-11. The religious leaders wanted to trap Jesus into saying something that they could use against Him. So they brought an adultrous woman to Him. How was this a trap?
- 4. Jesus response was to start writing on the floor. Why do you think Jesus did this? Although we have no idea what Jesus wrote, it's possible that He quote Hosea 6:6, where it says, "I desire mercy not acrifice." Jesus used this statement on at least two other occasions in dealing with the Pharisees. Read Hosea 6:6 and Matthew 9:9-13. What does Hosea 6:6 mean? (Also see: 1 Samuel 15:22; Psalm 51:16-17; Matthew 12:7) What do you see as being the main teaching of these passages?
- 5. Jesus finally stands and says to the accusers, "If any one of you is without sin, let him be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus didn't stare the men down, but stooped down and continued to write on the ground. One by one they left. This speaks well of the men in that their conscience's were not completely dead. We don't specifically know who these men were. It would be interesting to know what they did next.
