
How does the world 'pollute' us?

1. Read 1 Peter 1:13-16. From these verses, what are some of the steps are to take in order for us to live a holy life? 2. What does a holy life look like? 3. Why is holiness so important? (Give an answer to the question first, and then read Hebrews 12:14). 4. To be holy is an initial work of God in our lives, when we are first saved, and a process that the Holy Spirit works in us, to make us to be like Christ. This process is called sanctification. (Read 1 John 1:9; Philippians 1:6; Ephesians 4:22-24; 1 Thessalonians 5:23-24). From these verses describe the work of sanctification that takes place in our lives. What is our part in this process? 5. Read James 1:19-27. From these verses, Pastor Peter gave four practical steps towards purity. The first one was to be teachable, "Be quick to listen and slow to speak." Why is this so important? What do you think is the cause of us not being teachable? 6. The second step was, "Be changed." Verses 19b-25 list anger, moral filth and evil as the things in our life that need to be got rid of. James then gives the means by which we can change: To humbly accept the word planted in us and to be doers of the word and not just listeners. What does it mean to "humbly accept?" How does the Word of God change us?

7. Read James 1:23-25. James gives a description of how we will be blessed.

8. Step three was to, "Be Self-Controlled." Especially in the area of keeping a tight rein on our tongue. Why do you think this is so important in being
