- 7. On arrival in Bethlehem, they could find nowhere to stay. Note that it is also possible that Joseph has some relatives in Bethlehem, since he is of the house and line of David. Why would God have Jesus born in a stable. Mary had been told that her baby would be the Son of God. What was the Son of God doing being born in a stable?
- 8. Augustus had much too important things to deal with than to be concerned about a baby being born. King Herod felt threatened (Matthew 2:16), the religious leaders were too full of their own importance, the people of Bethlehem were too busy, or too unconcerned, to find room to a newborn child. What about you? Do you have room? Do you make time? Do important things, the busyness of life and the cares of this world come between you and your relationship with Jesus? Christmas is a great time to recommit yourself to getting to know your Saviour better.

- 4. Read Luke 2:1-3. These verses begin with, "In those days..." From your notes opposite, what were some of the reasons that mind this an ideal time for Jesus to come into the world?
- 5. When we realise how God has orchestrated the situations in the world at that time, to fulfill His purposes, what kind of confidence and peace should that instill in us, when we think about our own circumstances?
- 6. Read Luke 2:4-7. Now read the following prophecies and write down next to them what they say about the birth of Jesus.
