

Lesson #3 True contentment comes:

- 1. What are some of the things that cause us to be discontented with life?
- 2. Read 1 Kings 17:7-9. Put yourself in Elijah's shoes the brook has just dried up and God is telling you to make a 140km walk (with no water or food) to a foreign town to be cared for by a widow. As you make the journey, what are you thinking?
- 3. When the 'brook dries up' in our life, God wants us to learn that God is still in control, and wants us to learn to trust Him? Read Habakkuk 3:16-19. The prophet was watching his country being invaded when he wrote these words (Hab 3:16), but God gave him a different perspective. What can 'we' do to get that different perspective?
- 4. It was probably quite humbling for Elijah to have to rely on this widow to care for him. How and why does God need to humble us at times? (Also Read James 4:10)
- 5. Zarephath was in the region where Jezebel came from, and a centre of Baal worship. In order to find peace and contentment, we often need to face our issues head on. Whether it be to do with an issue from the past, an attitude, a sinful lifestyle, pride, anxiety etc. Is there an area of your life that God wants you to deal with?
- 6. Read 1 Kings 17:10-16. God knows what we need, and has a purpose bigger than our immediate needs. The widow only had a handful of flour and a little olive oil, enough to make bread for herself and her son, and die. What was Elijah's response?

What do you think were the initial thoughts of the widow?

Why was it important for her to make Elijah some bread first?

Why did she do what Elijah said?

Explain how faith comes to us (Read Romans 10:17)
