- 6. In John 21:17 Jesus uses the word Peter used for love, Phileo, rather than the word Jesus had been using until that point, agape? What is the significance of this, and how did Peter react?
- 7. Peter says, "Lord, you know all things; you <u>know</u> that I love you." The word Peter uses for "know" underlined in this verse, is a word that indicates a depth of knowledge that is personal and intimate. With this in mind, what does this say about the interaction between Jesus and Peter, and between Jesus and you? Also read the words of King David in Psalm 51:10-12.
- Read John 21:18-19 Three times Peter denied knowing Jesus. Three times Jesus re-established Peter's love, and three times Jesus appointed Peter to do look after those who would come to be followers of Jesus. These two verse talk about how Peter would eventually give his life for Jesus. He finishes by saying, "Follow Me."

With all this in mind what does this say about what it means to follow Jesus?

3 times Jesus appointed Peter to:

1. Psalm 51:1-2. David had committed adultery with Bathsheba and subsequently arranged for her husband, Uriah, to be killed. 4. Read Mark 16:1-7. After the resurrection of Jesus, an angel appeared to the women and told them to, "tell His disciples and Peter..." What is the significance of Peter being mentioned by name?

What does this say about how God will deal with us, if we have let God down in some way?

5. Read John 21:15-19. Why does Jesus ask Simon Peter three times if he loves Him? How do you think Peter is feeling during this interaction?
