## **Prison Ministry - Paul Robinson**


- Pray for the men to come to know Jesus Christ as their Saviour.

John 20:19 On the evening of that first day of the week, when the disciples were to gether, with the doors locked for fear of the Jewish leaders, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "!"
The disciples after Jesus' resurrection and the infilling of the Holy Spirit:

- 1. Read Isaiah 53:1-6. This passage in Isaiah was written 700 years before the birth of Christ, but paints an amazing picture of His crucifixion. What is the significance of this being written so long before it happened?
- 2. Isaiah 53:3-4 tells us that Jesus was, "a man of suffering, and familiar with pain," and that, "He, took up our pain and bore our suffering." Pain, suffering, grief, sadness, hardship etc. are all in this world because of sin. Knowing that Jesus identifies with our pain and suffering, and bore it on the cross, yet was without sin Himself. Why is this so significant?
- 3. Read Isaiah 53:5. Define transgression:

Define Iniquity:

The punishment that brough us peace was upon Him. What is the 'peace' that is being referred to here? (Also read Philippians 4:6-7 and John 14:27)

- 4. Read 1 Peter 2:21-25. Peter is quoting from Isaiah 53. From these verses, what is our responsibility having come to know Jesus?
- 4. Read Isaiah 53:6. From this verse, in what way are we like sheep?

Read John 10:1-5. Having come to know Jesus, what are the sheep like then?

Read John 10:11-18. Jesus is using the analogy of Isaiah 53:6 to explain to us why He had to die and how He much He loves us. From these verse identify as many ways as you can find that God shows His love for us.

- 5. Read Isaiah 53:7-9. These verses describe Jesus' trial before Pilate (Matthew 27:14), His crucifixion between two thieves (the wicked) and that He was buried in a rich man's grave (Joseph of Arimithea). As these verses, say, Jesus had done nothing to deserve crucifixion. Why is it important that Jesus fulfilled all these prophecies about Him? (Also read Matthew 5:17-18 and Luke 24:27)
- 6. Read Isaiah 53:10-12. Why was it the Lord's will to crush Him,, and in what way was Jesus life an offering for sin? (Also read Romans 6:23)
