

2. Read James 1:13-15. What is the source of temptation?
3. Read Genesis 3:12. In this passage, Adam blames the woman, and God, for his yielding to temptation. In what ways do we blame others, and God, for our failings?
4. Read Ephesians 4:22-24. What does this say has happened to the, "old self?"
What are we told to do in order to put on the, "new self?"
 James 1:14-16 explains the life cycle of temptation. Read it, and then put it in your own words in a practical way. Maybe, use an example of a typical temptation.
6. Temptation wouldn't be temptation if it wasn't something that we wanted. What are some of the ways that we rationalise giving in to temptation?
7. What does James mean when he says, "when it is full-grown, gives birth to death?"
In what ways do we 'die'?
8. James 1:16-18 gives us three keys that will enable us to be victorious over temptation. The first is: Be Ready. Verse 16 says, "Do not be deceived." We need to realise that we are being deceived into thinking that what we are being tempted with is good for us? We need to recognise the lie. Why is it that we so easily deceived at times?
What can we do to not be deceived? (Also read Ephesians 6:10-11)

1. Define temptation.
