


EMMANUEL PRAYER NEEDS

Small Group Questions—John 17:1-5 (+6-19)

Q1. What are you most looking forward to about heaven?

Q2. Does the idea of life everlasting: Make your head hurt? Cause you to have anxiety? Make you excited? Make you wonder if you even want it?

Q3. “Glorify your Son, that your Son may glorify you.” Read Isaiah 42:8. God will not share his glory with another. Knowing this, what does the fact that Jesus was glorified tell us? (Philippians 2:6-11).

Q4. Dan said that Jesus' masterwork, the work he finished for the Father, was done with surrender and humility. What can we learn from this? Why is it a difficult lesson?

Q5. Read John 17:3. We know that heaven is a real place, and we will physically be there for eternity. With that in mind, what does it mean that knowing God and Jesus *IS* eternal life?

Q6. Do you sometimes view Jesus as a pathway to blessing instead of he himself actually being the ultimate blessing?

What might be some problems with this sort of thinking?

Q7. Read John 5:24. Notice the tense of this verse... when does eternal life start?

Q8. If I have eternal life now, and it is best defined by relationship with God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, how might that understanding affect my life in the present?
