

John 2:9-10 The response of master of the banquet:

1. Read John 2:1-11. Try to put yourself in the position of the person who made all the arrangements for the wedding. Maybe more guests arrived than you thought, and there isn't enough for everyone. What are you thinking?

How significant to you is that Jesus is concerned about the relatively small things in our lives, as much as the big things?

- 2. John 2.2 says that Jesus was invited to the wedding. God is the author of marriage (Gen 2:24; Mark 10:7-9). That is why it is important for Jesus to be in the centre of our marriages. Pastor Peter gave three essential elements for a successful marriage. What were they? Give a definition of each, as they relate to your marriage. For those of you who aren't married, these are still essentials in every relationship.
- 3. Relative to those three essential elements, how is the presence of Jesus in the centre of our marriage and relationships, so important in enabling us to live those elements out?
- 4. In John 2:4-5, Mary told the servants to do whatever Jesus told them to do. Put yourselves in the position of a servant. What is going through your mind? What level of trust does it take to do what Jesus said? What are you thinking when you draw the wine out of the jug and take it to the master of the banquet?
- 5. Read Jeremiah 3:14; Matthew 22:1-14; Revelation 19:9; Ephesians 5:22-33. The miracle at Cana is spiritually significant in that it marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry and points to who He is. How is marriage meant to mirror God's relationship with the Church
- 6. Read Isaiah 5:1-7; Psalm 80:8-19; John 15:1-8. In these verses, we see Israel described as a vine planted by the Lord, but the vine didn't produce the kind of fruit that God wanted, and so he sent Jesus the true vine (Ps 80:15 John 15:1). The clay jars were for ceremonial cleansing, and represent the old covenant, and Jesus used these six jars (an imperfect number) to turn the water into wine. Now read Mark 2:22; Luke 22:20. How does what Jesus did by turning the water into wine, symbolize the whole of His ministry, and his reason for coming into the world?
