He wrote these words in his Bible. What did he mean by those words? If you are going to live likethat, this week, what will your days be like?


7. We are called to surrender our lives as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God. Let me ask you, who is in control of your life - you or God?

1. Read Matthew 13:44-46. Jesus gives two examples of what the kingdom of heaven is like. What is the main point that Jesus is making about heaven?

What is the response of those who are seeking the treasure and the pearls?

2. The Bible says things like: Love your enemies, Rejoice in the Lord always, Give thanks in all circumstances, Do everything without arguing or complaining, Be Holy as I am holy, Bless those who persecute you, Forgive one another as I have forgiven you, Be Perfect as your heavenly father is perfect, and many other statements like these. God doesn't tell us something to do that is impossible, so what is the only way that we can live up to these expectations?

3. Read Romans 12:1. The verse begins by saying, "Therefore, I urge you brothers and sisters, in view of God's mercy..." There is an urgency about what Paul is writing. Why?

Do you view life in light of the mercies of God, or in light of the situations you find yourself in, and the things you consider important? How do you think it would change your attitude if you started to consider life differently?

4. Offer your bodies as living sacrifices. (Also read 1 Corinthians 6:19-20). This is a decision that we have to make - to offer our bodies to God. What does it mean, and have you made that decision?

5. Offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God. What does it mean and what does it look like practically to live a life that is holy?
