7. Read John 1:32-34. When Jesus was baptized, the Holy Spirit came upon Him like a dove. When we receive Jesus, we receive the Holy Spirit. 




John 1:15-34 Look! The Lamb of God

- 1. When you hear that the people were living in darkness, what does that mean, and what does it seem like to you, if you were living in darkness?
- 2. Read Luke 1:13-17, Luke 3:3, Matthew 3:4 and John 1:1-8. John the Baptist was sent to point the way to Jesus. How has God used people in your life to point you to Jesus when you were in 'darkness'?

How does He continue to do that?

- 3. Read Isaiah 9:6-7, Jeremiah 23:5-6; Malachi 4:5; Deuteronomy 18:15. There are over 300 Old testament prophecies about a coming Messiah (which means 'anointed one'). When John the Baptist came, many thought that he might be the Messiah. It is also recorded by historians of that day, that there was an expectation that the Messiah was coming at that time. Put yourself in the position of a jewish person of that day. How would you have responded to the preaching of John the Baptist?
- 4. Read John 1:19-23 and Isaiah 40:1-5. Who does John say that he is?

Why do you think it was important for God to send John the Baptist?

Who are the people that have influenced you in your walk with the Lord? How?

- 5. Read John 1:29. Why is Jesus called the 'lamb of God'? (Hebrews 10 is a good reference for answering this question, especially verses 11-14). Also read the A.W. Tozer quote on the front cover, with reference to this verse.
- 6. Read John 1:30-31 and Matthew 3:13-16. John the Baptist says that the reason he came baptizing was that Jesus, 'might be revealed to Israel.' When Jesus came to be baptized, it was for that purpose, as Jesus did not have any sin that He needed to be cleansed of. It was a public declaration of His ministry, it showed that He identified with sinners and gave us the example of our need to be baptized. Now read Romans 6:1-4. Pastor Peter gave four important aspects of baptism. What were they? Explain each one.
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
