- For us all to corporately present all requests, concerns, petitions to lay it all at the feet of Jesus.


E.M.Bounds wrote, "The very essence of prayer is the spirit of devotion and is the mightiest agent to advance God's purpose."

- Pray earnestly, fervently, every day, pray for people, for yourself, pray continuously, give thanks, pray for whatever comes to your mind, pray, pray, pray!


Study Continued

5. What does Daniel 1:17 tell us about where Daniel and the others got their insight? There are a number of references in the book of Daniel that point to Daniel receiving his insight from the Spirit of God (eg. Daniel 5:11). Romans 8:9 tells us as Christians that we have the Spirit of Christ within us. Ephesians 5:18 tells us to be filled with the Holy Spirit. Galatians 5:16 & 5:25 tell us to walk by the Spirit, live by the Spirit and keep in step with the Spirit. How do we do this?
6. Read Daniel 1:2, 9 & 17. What do you notice about each of these verses? In what way is this significant in our lives when it comes to the challenges we face? How does knowing that God is in control, even in what seems like negative things, enable us to trust Him with the outcome?
7. Daniel had resolved to live for God long before he was faced with this test. So, this week, will you be resolved to stand alone, if necessary, for the glory of God and the cause of Christ. Now pray for the strength to do so.



Eusebius of Caesarea c.265-339
Bishop, Theologian and Church historian.

When the Emperor Valens threatened Eusebius with confiscation of all his goods, torture, banishment, or even death, the courageous Eusebius replied:
"He needs not fear confiscation, who has nothing to lose; nor banishment, to whom heaven is his country; nor torments, when his body can be destroyed at one blow; nor death, which is the only way to set him free from sin and sorrow."

It would be easy to think that Nebuchadnezzar was calling the shots, but read verses 2, 9, & 17. What do they tell you?

1. Read Daniel 1:1-7. After the defeat of Judah to King Nebuchadnezzar, Daniel and his friends have been taken from their families, as teenagers, 2700KM to Babylon, with the intent of turning them into good Babylonians who will serve the king. From this passage, examine the pressures on these young men. How hard would it have been to stay true to God?

Read Romans 12:1-2. What do these two verses teach us as Christians, in standing up to the indoctrination of the world?

2. How hard do you think it is to live a life that honours God in our culture? What does a life that honours God look like?

What is the attitude towards Christianity and Christians in the workplace, school, university, politics, in the media etc?

Read John 17:13-19. What does it mean to be in the world, but not of the world? From this passage, what do we have to give us the strength to stand?

3. Verse 8 says, "But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine." What does 'Daniel resolved' mean?

Go back to Romans 12:1-2. From these two verses, how must we 'resolve' ourselves?

4. Daniel resolved to live his life according to the word of God. One of the best passages in the New Testament on standing against the world is found in Ephesians 6:10-18. First of all, how many times is the word 'stand' used? Why do you think this is repeated so much?

What are the devils schemes? Why is our battle not against flesh and blood?

Go through each of the pieces of armour and explain what each means practically in standing against the enemy?
